### Grammar :

in order to + V1

- Use to express a purpose
- I scrolled down *in order to read* the text.
- I scrolled down *because* I wanted to read the text.
- I scrolled down *to read* the text.

For + Noun Phrase / Gerund Phrase

- Use > to express a purpose
- She emailed me *for some advice.*
- They shop online *for electronic products*.
- I use my smart phone *for e-mailing clients*.

#### Comparison : Equal Degree

#### as + adj / adv + as

- Use to indicate how 2 things are equal or the same.
- Samsung tablet is *as light as* iPad 2.

not as + adj / adv + as

not so + adj / adv + as

## Equal Degree

- Use to indicate how 2 things are different.
- Samsung tablet is *not as light as* iPad 2.
- Samsung tablet is *not so light as* iPad

Adj / adv + er + than More + adj / adv + than

## Comparative Degree

- Use to indicate how 2 things are different.
- Samsung tablet is *lighter than* iPad 2.

iPad 2 is more expensive than Samsung Tablet

The + Adj/adv + est The + most + adj / adv

#### Superlative Degree

- Use to indicate how one thing is different from 2 or more other things.
- iPhone 5 is *the newest* smart phone.
- Facebook is *the most popular* social network.
