DON'T use <u>for</u> before <u>to</u>

- ☐ She emailed me <u>for</u> some advice.
- ☐ She emailed me <u>for</u> to ask a question.

Equal Degree \square Form > ■ Use > to indicate how 2 things are equal or the same. ☐ Samsung tablet is as light as iPad 2.



Equal Degree

not as adj / adv as

not so adj / adv as

- Use > to indicate how 2 things are different.
- ☐ Samsung tablet is *not as light as* iPad 2.
- ☐ Samsung tablet is *not so light as* iPad 2.



Comparative Degree

☐ Form >

adj / adv + er + than more + adj / adv + than

☐ Use > to indicate how 2 things are different.

☐ Samsung tablet is *lighter than* iPad 2.

☐ iPad 2 is more expensive than Samsung Tablet.



Superlative Degree

☐ Form >

The +adj / adv + est

The most + adj / adv

- ☐ Use > to indicate how one thing is different from 2 or more other things.
- ☐ iPhone 5 is *the newest* smart phone.
- ☐ Facebook is the most popular social network.
